A BILL

- To amend the Public Health Service Act to provide health care practitioners in rural areas with training in preventive health care, including both physical and mental care, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Rural Preventive
 - 5 Health Care Training Act of 1997".
 - 6 SEC. 2. PREVENTIVE HEALTH CARE TRAINING.
 - 7 Section 778 of the Public Health Service Act (42
 - 8 U.S.C. 294p) is amended—

- **[**(1) in subsection (b)(3)(C), by striking "this section" and inserting "subsection (a)"; **]**
 - (2) by redesignating subsections (e) and (f) as subsections (f) and (g), respectively;
 - (3) by inserting after subsection (d) the following new subsection:
 - "(e) Preventive Health Care Training.—
 - "(1) In General.—The Secretary may make grants to, and enter into contracts with, eligible applicants to enable such applicants to provide preventive health care training, in accordance with paragraph (3), to health care practitioners practicing in rural areas. Such training shall, to the extent practicable, include training in health care to prevent both physical and mental disorders before the initial occurrence of such disorders. In carrying out this paragraph, the Secretary shall encourage, but may not require, the use of interdisciplinary training project applications.
 - "(2) LIMITATION.—To be eligible to receive training using assistance provided under paragraph (1), a health care practitioner shall be determined by the eligible applicant involved to be practicing, or desiring to practice, in a rural area.

1	"(3) Use of assistance.—Amounts received
2	under a grant made or contract entered into under
3	this subsection shall be used—
4	"(A) to provide student stipends to individ-
5	uals attending rural community colleges or
6	other institutions that service predominantly
7	rural communities, for the purpose of enabling
8	the individuals to receive preventive health care
9	training;
10	"(B) to increase staff support at rural
11	community colleges or other institutions that
12	service predominantly rural communities to fa-
13	cilitate the provision of preventive health care
14	training;
15	"(C) to provide training in appropriate re-
16	search and program evaluation skills in rural
17	communities;
18	"(D) to create and implement innovative
19	programs and curricula with a specific preven-
20	tion component; and
21	"(E) for other purposes as the Secretary
22	determines to be appropriate.
23	"(4) Authorization of appropriations.—
24	There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out

1	this subsection, \$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years
2	1998 through 2000."; and
3	(4) in subsection (g) (as so redesignated), by
4	inserting "except subsection (e)," after "section,".

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
