## A BILL

To provide for the expansion of the historic community cemetery of El Rito, New Mexico, through the special designation of five acres of Carson National Forest adjacent to the cemetery.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 (a) The village of El Rito, New Mexico (El Rito), is
- 5 a small community of approximately 2,500 residents, com-
- 6 pletely surrounded by the Carson National Forest in New
- 7 Mexico.

- 1 (b) The historic community cemetery El Rito is adja-
- 2 cent to the lands of the Carson National Forest in New
- 3 Mexico. After generations of use, there is no more avail-
- 4 able space left in the cemetery and the community mem-
- 5 bers are required to get special permits to bury their de-
- 6 ceased on Forest Service land.
- 7 (c) The requirement for special use permits creates
- 8 an undue bureaucratic requirement upon families within
- 9 the El Rito community times when they are suffering from
- 10 grief.

## 11 SEC. 2. DESIGNATION OF LANDS.

- 12 The Secretary of Agriculture, acting through the
- 13 United States Department of Agriculture Forest Service
- 14 shall designate five acres of land in the Carson National
- 15 Forest adjacent to the historic El Rito cemetery as special
- 16 use land for use as cemetery land for members of the El
- 17 Rito community to bury their deceased.
