A BILL

To protect the voting rights of homeless citizens.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Voting Rights of
- 5 Homeless Citizens Act of 1997".
- 6 SEC. 2. VOTING RIGHTS OF HOMELESS CITIZENS.
- 7 No voting qualification or prerequisite to voting, or
- 8 standard, practice, or procedure shall be imposed or ap-
- 9 plied by any State or political subdivision to deny or
- 10 abridge the right of any citizen of the United States to
- 11 vote because that citizen resides at or in a nontraditional
- 12 abode.

1 SEC. 3. ENFORCEMENT.

- 2 The Attorney General may commence in the name of
- 3 the United States a civil action (including an action
- 4 against a State or political subdivision) or an aggrieved
- 5 citizen may institute a proceeding under this Act, for in-
- 6 junctive relief against a violation of section 2.

7 SEC. 4. RELATIONSHIP TO VOTING RIGHTS ACT OF 1965.

- 8 This Act shall not be construed to impair any right
- 9 guaranteed by the Voting Rights Act of 1965 (42 U.S.C.
- 10 1973 et seq.).

11 SEC. 5. DEFINITIONS.

- 12 As used in this Act, the term "nontraditional abode"
- 13 includes—
- 14 (1) a supervised publicly or privately operated
- shelter designed to provide temporary living accom-
- modations (including welfare hotels, congregate shel-
- ters, and transitional housing for the mentally ill);
- 18 and
- 19 (2) a public or private place not designated for,
- or ordinarily used as, regular sleeping accommoda-
- 21 tion for human beings.

22 SEC. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- This Act applies with respect to elections taking place
- 24 after December 31, 1997.

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
