AN ACT

To direct the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to convey certain lands to the county of Rio Arriba, New Mexico.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. OLD COYOTE ADMINISTRATIVE SITE.

2	(a) Conveyance of Property.—Not later than one
3	year after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary
4	of the Interior (herein "the Secretary") shall convey to
5	the County of Rio Arriba, New Mexico (herein "the Coun-
6	ty"), subject to the terms and conditions stated in sub-
7	section (b), all right, title, and interest of the United
8	States in and to the land (including all improvements on
9	the land) known as the "Old Coyote Administrative Site"
10	located approximately ½ mile east of the Village of Coy-
11	ote, New Mexico, on State Road 96, comprising one tract
12	of 130.27 acres (as described in Public Land Order 3730),
13	and one tract of 276.76 acres (as described in Executive
14	Order 4599).
15	(b) Terms and Conditions.—
16	(1) Consideration for the conveyance described
17	in subsection (a) shall be—
18	(A) an amount that is consistent with the
19	special pricing program for Governmental enti-
20	ties under the Recreation and Public Purposes
21	Act; and
22	(B) an agreement between the Secretary
23	and the County indemnifying the Government
24	of the United States from all liability of the
25	Government that arises from the property.

1	(2) The lands conveyed by this Act shall be
2	used for public purposes. If such lands cease to be
3	used for public purposes, at the option of the United
4	States, such lands will revert to the United States.
5	(c) Land Withdrawals under
6	Public Land Order 3730 and Executive Order 4599 as
7	extended in the Federal Register on May 25, 1989 (54
8	F.R. 22629) shall be revoked simultaneous with the con-
9	veyance of the property under subsection (a).
