A BILL

For the relief of Susan Rebola Cardenas.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.
- 4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for pur-
- 5 poses of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 6 1101 et seq.), Susan Rebola Cardenas shall be held and
- 7 considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United
- 8 States for permanent residence as of the date of the enact-
- 9 ment of this Act upon payment of the required visa fee.
- 10 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.
- 11 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Susan
- 12 Rebola Cardenas as provided in this Act, the Secretary

- 1 of State shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by one
- 2 number during the current fiscal year the total number
- 3 of immigrant visas available to natives of the country of
- 4 the alien's birth under section 203(a) of the Immigration
- 5 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)).
