AN ACT

- To elevate the position of Director of the Indian Health Service within the Department of Health and Human Services to Assistant Secretary for Indian Health, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

2 SECTION 1. OFFICE OF ASSISTANT SECRETARY FOR INDIAN 2 HEALTH. 3 (a) Establishment.—There is established within the Department of Health and Human Services the Office 4 5 of the Assistant Secretary for Indian Health in order to, in a manner consistent with the government-to-government relationship between the United States and Indian tribes— 8 9 (1) facilitate advocacy for the development of 10 appropriate Indian health policy; and 11 (2) promote consultation on matters related to 12 Indian health. 13 (b) Assistant Secretary for Indian Health.— In addition to the functions performed on the date of enactment of this Act by the Director of the Indian Health 15 Service, the Assistant Secretary for Indian Health shall perform such functions as the Secretary of Health and 17 18 Human Services may designate. The Assistant Secretary 19 for Indian Health shall— 20 (1) report directly to the Secretary concerning 21 all policy- and budget-related matters affecting In-22 dian health; 23

(2) collaborate with the Assistant Secretary for 24 Health concerning appropriate matters of Indian 25 health that affect the agencies of the Public Health 26 Service:

16	of the Indian Health Service shall be deemed to refer to
17	the Assistant Secretary for Indian Health.

19	Health Service on the date preceding the date of enact-
20	ment of this Act may serve as Assistant Secretary for In-
21	dian Health, at the pleasure of the President after the
22	date of enactment of this Act.
