A BILL

To amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to increase the Federal minimum wage.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fair Minimum Wage

1 SEC. 2. MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE.

2 (a) Wage.—Paragraph (1) of section 6(a) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. 206(a)(1)) is 3 4 amended to read as follows: "(1) except as otherwise provided in this sec-5 tion, not less than— 6 "(A) \$5.65 an hour during the year begin-7 8 ning on January 1, 1999; and "(B) \$6.15 an hour during the year begin-9 ning on January 1, 2000.". 10 11 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
