A BILL

To amend the American Folklife Preservation Act to permanently authorize the American Folklife Center of the Library of Congress.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.
- 4 (a) Findings.—Congress makes the following find-
- 5 ings:
- 6 (1) The American Folklife Center in the Li-
- 7 brary of Congress was created by Congress in 1976,
- 8 building on the vast expertise and archival material
- 9 existing at the Library since 1928.

1	(2) As an instrumentality of the Congress, it is
2	fitting that the American Folklife Center should
3	have a direct and close relationship with the rep-
4	resentatives of the people, who are best able to over-
5	see the ongoing activities of the Center to preserve
6	and promote the cultural traditions of the people,
7	and to ensure that the resources of the Center be
8	readily available to all Americans.
9	(3) In over 20 years since its creation, the
10	American Folklife Center in the Library of Congress

- has—
 - (A) increased the size of the Archive of Folk Culture from 500,000 to 1,500,000 multiformat ethnographic items;
 - (B) engaged in 15 cultural surveys and field documentation projects in all regions of the country;
 - (C) provided publications, documentary equipment on loan, and advisory and reference service to persons and institutions in all 50 States;
 - (D) produced exhibitions and other educational programs on American Folklife at the Library and around the country;

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- 1 (E) begun sharing its unique collections in 2 digital form via the Internet; and 3 (F) served as a national center for the pro-4 fessions of folklore, ethnomusicology, and cultural studies. 6 (4) Congress has consistently provided encour-7 agement and support of American Folklife as an ap-8 propriate matter of concern to the Federal Govern-9 ment, passing legislation to reauthorize the Center 8 10 times since its creation in 1976. 11 (5) The American Folklife Center is the only 12 unit in the Library of Congress which is not perma-13 nently authorized. Since its establishment in 1976, 14 the Center's collections and activities have been fully 15 and successfully integrated into the Library of Con-16 gress. It is useful to statutorily conform the Amer-17 ican Folklife Center with the rest of the Library of

RECTOR POSITION.—Section 4 of the American Folklife Preservation Act (20 U.S.C. 2103) is amended— 3 (1) by striking subsection (b) and inserting the 4 following: 5 "(b)(1) The Center shall be under the direction of a Board of Trustees. The Board shall be composed as fol-7 lows-"(A) four members appointed by the President 8 9 from among individuals who are officials of Federal 10 departments and agencies concerned with some as-11 pect of American Folklife traditions and arts; 12 "(B) four members appointed by the President 13 pro tempore of the Senate from among individuals 14 from private life who are widely recognized by virtue 15 of their scholarship, experience, creativity, or inter-16 est in American Folklife traditions and arts, and 17 four members appointed by the Speaker of the 18 House of Representatives from among such individ-19 uals; "(C) four members appointed by the Librarian 20 21 of Congress from among individuals who are widely 22 recognized by virtue of their scholarship, experience, 23 creativity, or interest in American folklife traditions 24 and arts; 25 "(D) the Librarian of Congress;

"(E) the Secretary of the Smithsonian Institu-1 2 tion; "(F) the Chairman of the National Endowment 3 4 for the Arts; "(G) the Chairman of the National Endowment 5 6 for the Humanities; 7 "(H) the President of the American Folklore 8 Society; "(I) 9 the President of the Society for 10 Ethnomusicology; and 11 "(J) the Director of the Center. "(2) In making appointments from private life under 12 paragraph (1)(B), the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall 14 15 give due consideration to the appointment of individuals who collectively will provide appropriate diversity and re-17 gional balance on the Board. Not more than 3 of the members appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate 18 19 or by the Speaker of the House of Representatives may 20 be affiliated with the same political party. 21 "(3) In making appointments under paragraph 22 (1)(C), the Librarian of Congress shall include at least 23 2 members who direct or are members of the boards of

major American folklife organizations other than the

American Folklore Society and the Society for 2 Ethnomusicology."; 3 (2) by striking subsection (d) and inserting the 4 following: 5 "(d) Members of the Board shall serve without pay, but members who are not regular full-time employees of the United States may, at the discretion of the Librarian, 8 be reimbursed for the actual and necessary traveling and 9 subsistence expenses incurred by them in the performance of the duties of the Board."; 10 11 (3) in subsection (e)— 12 (A) in the fourth sentence of paragraph (1), by inserting "currently serving" after 13 14 "Board"; and 15 (B) by adding at the end the following: "(3) The Board shall meet at least once each fiscal 16 year."; 17 18 (4) by striking subsection (f) and inserting the 19 following: 20 "(f) After consultation with the Board, the Librarian 21 shall appoint the Director of the Center. The basic pay 22 of the Director shall be at an annual rate that is not less 23 than an amount equal to 120% of the minimum rate of basic pay payable for GS-15 of the General Schedule nor more than an amount equal to the pay payable under level

IV of the Executive Schedule under section 5315 of title 2 5."; and 3 (5) in subsection (g)— (A) in paragraph (1), by striking the paragraph designation; and 6 (B) by striking paragraph (2). (b) Administrative Provisions.—Section 7(a)(4) 7 8 of the American Folklife Preservation Act (20 U.S.C. 2106(a)(4)) is amended by striking ", but no individual 10 so appointed shall receive compensation in excess of the rate received by the Deputy Director of the Center". 11 SEC. 3. PERMANENT AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIA-13 TIONS. 14 Section 8 of the American Folklife Preservation Act 15 (20 U.S.C. 2107) is amended to read as follows: "SEC. 8. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS. 16 17 "There are authorized to be appropriated to the Center to carry out this Act such sums as may be necessary 18 for each fiscal year.". 19 SEC. 4. BOARD OF TRUSTEES, TRANSITION PERIOD. 21 The term of office of members of the Board of Trustees appointed by the Librarian of Congress under the

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1	(1) of the 4 members first appointed by the Li-
2	brarian, 1 shall serve for a term of 2 years, 2 for
3	a term of 4 years, and 1 for a term of 6 years;

- (2) any member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring prior to expiration of the term to which his or her predecessor was appointed shall be appointed for the remainder of such term; and
- (3) the terms of the Presidents of the American Folklore Society and the Society for Ethnomusicology shall be coterminous with their terms of office.

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
