1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, SECTION 1. MARKING OF CERTAIN SILK PRODUCTS AND 4 THEIR CONTAINERS. 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 304 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1304) is amended— 6 7 (1) by redesignating subsections (h), (i), (j), 8 and (k) as subsections (i), (j), (k), and (l), respec-9 tively; and 10 (2) by inserting after subsection (g) the follow-

- 1 "(h) Marking of Certain Silk Products.—The
- 2 marking requirements of subsections (a) and (b) shall not
- 3 apply to—
- 4 "(1) articles provided for in subheading
- 5 6214.10.10 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of
- 6 the United States, as in effect on January 1, 1997,
- 7 which contain 70 percent or more by weight of silk
- 8 or silk waste; or
- 9 "(2) goods provided for in heading 5007 of the
- Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States, as
- in effect on January 1, 1997.".
- 12 (b) Conforming Amendment.—Section 304(j) of
- 13 such Act, as redesignated by subsection (a)(1), is amended
- 14 by striking "subsection (h)" and inserting "subsection

- 16 (c) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 17 this section apply to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 18 warehouse for consumption, on or after the date of enact-
- 19 ment of this Act.
