## A BILL

To amend the Controlled Substances Act with respect to penalties for crimes involving cocaine, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

### 3   **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Powder Cocaine Man-  
5       datory Minimum Sentencing Act of 1998”.

### 6   **SEC. 2. SENTENCING FOR VIOLATIONS INVOLVING CO-** 7       **CAINE POWDER.**

8       (a) AMENDMENT OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES  
9       ACT.—

1           (1)           LARGE           QUANTITIES.—Section  
2       401(b)(1)(A)(ii) of the Controlled Substances Act  
3       (21 U.S.C. 841(b)(1)(A)(ii)) is amended by striking  
4       “5 kilograms” and inserting “500 grams”.

5           (2)           SMALL           QUANTITIES.—Section  
6       401(b)(1)(B)(ii) of the Controlled Substances Act  
7       (21 U.S.C. 841(b)(1)(B)(ii)) is amended by striking  
8       “500 grams” and inserting “50 grams”.

9       (b) AMENDMENT OF SENTENCING GUIDELINES.—  
10 Pursuant to section 994 of title 28, United States Code,  
11 the United States Sentencing Commission shall promul-  
12 gate guidelines or amend existing guidelines to reflect the  
13 amendment made by subsection (a).
