A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to grant an easement to Chugach Alaska Corporation, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CHUGACH ALASKA CORPORATION SETTLE-
- 4 MENT IMPLEMENTATION.
- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 6 sion of law, not later than December 11, 1998, the Sec-
- 7 retary of Agriculture shall grant Chugach Alaska Corpora-
- 8 tion an irrevocable and perpetual 500-foot-wide easement
- 9 for the construction, use, and maintenance of nonpublic
- 10 roads and related facilities necessary for access to and eco-

- 1 nomic development of the land interests in the Carbon
- 2 Mountain and Katalla vicinity that were conveyed to Chu-
- 3 gach Alaska Corporation pursuant to the Alaska Native
- 4 Claims Settlement Act. The centerline of the easement is
- 5 depicted on the map entitled "Carbon Mountain Access
- 6 Easement" and dated November 4, 1997.
- 7 (b) Submission of Survey; Relinquishment of
- 8 Unneeded Portion of Easement.—Not later than 90
- 9 days after completion of construction of roads and related
- 10 facilities on the easement granted pursuant to subsection
- 11 (a), Chugach Alaska Corporation shall submit to the Sec-
- 12 retary of Agriculture an as-built survey of such roads and
- 13 related facilities and relinquish to the United States those
- 14 portions of the easement Chugach Alaska Corporation
- 15 deems not necessary for future use.
- 16 (c) Construction and Maintenance.—Construc-
- 17 tion and maintenance of any roads pursuant to subsection
- 18 (a) shall be in accordance with the best management prac-
- 19 tices of the Forest Service as promulgated in the Forest
- 20 Service Handbook.
