A BILL

To amend title 42, United States Code, to protect human life.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Human Life Act of
- 5 1998".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROTECTION OF HUMAN LIFE.
- 7 (a) In General.—Title 42 of the United States
- 8 Code shall be amended at the end thereof by adding the
- 9 following new chapter:

2 1 "CHAPTER 2 "§ ____. Protection of human life 3 "(a) The Congress finds that the right to life is the paramount and most fundamental right of a person. 4 5 "(b) The Congress further finds that the life of each human being begins at fertilization. 6 7 "(c) Upon the basis of these findings, and in the exercise of the power of Congress under section 5 of the fourteenth amendment to the Constitution, the Congress here-10 by recognizes that for the purpose of enforcing the obligation of the States under the fourteenth amendment not to deprive persons of life without due process of law, nor to deny persons within their jurisdictions the equal protection of the laws, the word 'person' applies to all human beings, irrespective of age, health, function, or condition of dependency, including their unborn offspring at every 17 stage of their biological development including fertiliza-18 tion. 19

"(d) No unborn child shall be deprived of life by any person: *Provided, however*, That nothing in this section shall prohibit a law allowing justification to be shown for only those medical procedures required to prevent the death of either the pregnant woman or her unborn offspring as long as such a law requires every reasonable ef-

25 fort to be made to preserve the lives of both of them.".
