A BILL

To amend the Sherman Act and the Federal Trade Commission Act with respect to commerce with foreign nations.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Trade Law Enforce-
- 5 ment Improvement Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS.
- 7 (a) Amendment to the Sherman Act.—Section 7
- 8 of the Sherman Act (15 U.S.C. 6a) is amended by striking
- 9 the period at the end and inserting the following: "and
- 10 without regard to the effect of such conduct on consumers

- 1 in the United States. A determination of whether the ef-
- 2 fect of such conduct is substantial may be made solely with
- 3 reference to the product or type of product affected by
- 4 the conduct and the geographical area in which the con-
- 5 duct occurs.".
- 6 (b) Amendment to the Federal Trade Commis-
- 7 SION ACT.—Section 5(a)(3) of the Federal Trade Com-
- 8 mission Act (15 U.S.C. 45(a)(3)) is amended by striking
- 9 the period at the end and inserting the following: "and
- 10 without regard to the effect of such methods of competi-
- 11 tion on consumers in the United States. A determination
- 12 of whether the effect of such methods of competition is
- 13 substantial may be made solely with reference to the prod-
- 14 uct or type of product affected by such methods of com-
- 15 petition and the geographical area in which such methods
- 16 of competition occur.".
