A BILL

To increase the funding authorization for the James River, South Dakota, flood control project and direct the Secretary of the Army to enter into a programmatic agreement with the non-Federal sponsor of the project.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “James River, South
5 Dakota, Flood Control Project Act of 1998”.

1 **SEC. 2. JAMES RIVER, SOUTH DAKOTA, FLOOD CONTROL**
2 **PROJECT.**

3 The undesignated paragraph under the heading
4 “JAMES RIVER, SOUTH DAKOTA” in section 401(b) of the
5 Water Resources Development Act of 1986 (100 Stat.
6 4128) is amended—

7 (1) in the first sentence—

8 (A) by striking “\$20,000,000” and insert-
9 ing “\$100,000,000”;

10 (B) by striking “\$15,000,000” and insert-
11 ing “\$75,000,000”; and

12 (C) by striking “\$5,000,000” and inserting
13 “\$25,000,000”; and

14 (2) by adding at the end the following: “The
15 Secretary shall enter into a programmatic agreement
16 with the James River Water Development District,
17 which, as the non-Federal sponsor of the project,
18 shall perform the restoration and construct the im-
19 provements in coordination with the Secretary. Non-
20 Federal funds that, before the date of enactment of
21 the James River, South Dakota, Flood Control
22 Project Act of 1998, were documented to have been
23 spent on the restoration effort of the James River
24 since the date of enactment of this Act may be

- 1 counted as part of the required non-Federal match
- 2 for Federal funds.”.
