Mr. Thompson introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

A BILL

To provide for establishment of a memorial to sportsmen.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Sportsmen's Memorial
- 5 Act of 1998".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds that—
- 8 (1) the conservation of the fish and wildlife re-
- 9 sources of the United States is of critical importance
- to all citizens;

- 1 (2) numerous Federal and State agencies have 2 been created to manage the conservation of our fish 3 and wildlife resources;
 - (3) numerous national, State, and local associations have been created to support the conservation of our fish and wildlife resources;
 - (4) standing at the forefront of those collective efforts are sportsmen, whose financial support to the fish and wildlife conservation efforts of the United States amounts to tens of billions of dollars;
 - (5) sportsmen have been the financial and philosophical backbone of successful fish and wildlife management throughout the 20th century;
 - (6) sportsmen's support has allowed fish and wildlife managers to protect and restore millions of acres of habitat, engage in high quality research on a multitude of fish and wildlife species, and actively manage our fish and wildlife resources on a day-to-day basis;
 - (7) through the Act entitled "An Act to provide that the United States shall aid the States in wild-life-restoration projects, and for other purposes", approved September 2, 1937 (commonly known as the "Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act") (16 U.S.C. 669 et seq.), the Act entitled "An Act to pro-

- 1 vide that the United States shall aid the States in 2 fish restoration and management projects, and for 3 other purposes", approved August 9, 1950 (commonly known as the "Federal Aid in Fish Restoration Act") (16 U.S.C. 777 et seq.), and the migra-5 6 tory bird hunting and conservation stamp program, 7 sportsmen have contributed billions of dollars for the 8 betterment of the fish and wildlife resources of the 9 United States and the conservation of fish and wild-10 life habitat;
 - (8) sportsmen, through their purchase of State hunting and fishing licenses, stamps, and tags, have contributed additional billions of dollars directly to State fish and wildlife agencies for the betterment of fish and wildlife resources and the conservation of fish and wildlife habitat;
 - (9) sportsmen, through their voluntary contributions to fish and wildlife conservation associations, have conserved additional millions of acres of habitat and a multitude of fish and wildlife species; and
 - (10) this support has allowed fish and wildlife managers to achieve some of our greatest fish and wildlife conservation successes, including the North American wild elk, striped bass, wild turkey,

3 SEC. 3. MEMORIAL TO SPORTSMEN.

- 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior may
- 5 permit the Sportsmen's Wildlife Foundation (a nonprofit
- 6 corporation established under the law of the State of Ten-
- 7 nessee) to establish in the District of Columbia or its envi-
- 8 rons a memorial to honor sportsmen in accordance with
- 9 the Commemorative Works Act (40 U.S.C. 1001 et seq.).
- 10 (b) Compliance With Standards for Commemo-
- 11 RATIVE WORKS.—The establishment of the memorial shall
- 12 be in accordance with the Commemorative Works Act (40)
- 13 U.S.C. 1001 et seq.).
- 14 (c) Payment of Expenses.—The Sportsmen's
- 15 Wildlife Foundation shall be solely responsible for accept-
- 16 ance of contributions for, and payment of the expenses
- 17 of, the establishment of the memorial. Federal funds shall
- 18 not be used to pay any expense of the establishment of
- 19 the memorial.
- 20 (d) Deposit of Excess Funds.—If, upon payment
- 21 of all expenses of the establishment of the memorial (in-
- 22 cluding the maintenance and preservation amount re-
- 23 quired to be donated under section 8(b) of the Commemo-
- 24 rative Works Act (40 U.S.C. 1008(b))), or upon expiration
- 25 of the authority for the memorial under section 10(b) of

- 1 that Act (40 U.S.C. 1010(b)), there remains a balance of
- 2 funds received for the establishment of the memorial, the
- 3 Sportsmen's Wildlife Foundation shall transmit the
- 4 amount of the balance to the Secretary of the Treasury
- 5 for deposit in the account provided for in section 8(b)(1)
- 6 of that Act (40 U.S.C. 1008(b)(1)).
