## A BILL

For the relief of Rose-Marie Barbeau-Quinn.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.
- 4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for pur-
- 5 poses of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 6 1101 et seq.), Rose-Marie Barbeau-Quinn shall be held
- 7 and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the Unit-
- 8 ed States for permanent residence as of the date of the
- 9 enactment of this Act upon payment of the required visa
- 10 fee.

#### 1 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.

- 2 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Rose-
- 3 Marie Barbeau-Quinn as provided in this Act, the Sec-
- 4 retary of State shall instruct the proper officer to reduce
- 5 by one number during the current fiscal year the total
- 6 number of immigrant visas available to natives of the
- 7 country of the alien's birth under section 203(a) of the
- 8 Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)).
