Mr. WYDEN (for himself and Mr. SMITH of Oregon) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Rose-Marie Barbeau-Quinn.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.**

4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for pur-
5 poses of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
6 1101 et seq.), Rose-Marie Barbeau-Quinn shall be held
7 and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the Unit-
8 ed States for permanent residence as of the date of the
9 enactment of this Act upon payment of the required visa
10 fee.

1 **SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.**

2 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Rose-
3 Marie Barbeau-Quinn as provided in this Act, the Sec-
4 retary of State shall instruct the proper officer to reduce
5 by one number during the current fiscal year the total
6 number of immigrant visas available to natives of the
7 country of the alien's birth under section 203(a) of the
8 Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)).
