A BILL

To provide for a reduction in regulatory costs by maintaining Federal average fuel economy standards applicable to automobiles in effect at current levels until changed by law, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. AVERAGE FUEL ECONOMY STANDARDS.
- 4 Beginning on the date of enactment of this Act, the
- 5 average fuel economy standards established (whether di-
- 6 rectly or indirectly) under regulations promulgated by the
- 7 Secretary of Transportation under chapter 329 of title 49,

- 1 United States Code, prior to the date of enactment of this
- 2 Act for automobiles (as that term is defined in section
- 3 32901 of title 49, United States Code) that are in effect
- 4 on the day before the date of enactment of this Act, shall
- 5 apply without amendment, change, or other modification
- 6 of any kind (whether direct or indirect) for—
- 7 (1) the model years specified in the regulations;
- 8 (2) the applicable automobiles specified in the
- 9 regulations last promulgated for such automobiles;
- 10 and
- 11 (3) each model year thereafter;
- 12 until chapter 329 of title 49, United States Code, is spe-
- 13 cifically amended to authorize an amendment, change, or
- 14 other modification to such standards or is otherwise modi-
- 15 fied or superseded by law.
