A BILL

To deauthorize the Animas-La Plata Federal reclamation project and to direct the Secretary of the Interior to enter into negotiations to satisfy, in a manner consistent with all Federal laws, the water rights interests of the Ute Mountain Ute Indian Tribe and the Southern Ute Indian Tribe.

1 **SECTION 1. DEAUTHORIZATION OF ANIMAS-LA PLATA FED-**
 2 **ERAL RECLAMATION PROJECT.**

3 (a) DEAUTHORIZATION.—The Animas-La Plata
 4 Project, Colorado and New Mexico (a participating project
 5 under the Act of April 11, 1956 (commonly known as the
 6 “Colorado River Storage Project Act”) (70 Stat. 105,
 7 chapter 203; 43 U.S.C. 620 et seq.), and the Colorado
 8 River Basin Project Act (43 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.)) is not
 9 authorized after the date of enactment of this Act.

10 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—The first section of
 11 the Act of April 11, 1956 (70 Stat. 105, chapter 203; 43
 12 U.S.C. 620), is amended in the proviso by striking
 13 “Animas-La Plata,”.

14 (c) NEGOTIATIONS.—The Secretary of the Interior
 15 shall promptly seek to enter into negotiations with the Ute
 16 Mountain Ute Indian Tribe and the Southern Ute Indian
 17 Tribe to satisfy, in a manner consistent with all Federal
 18 laws, the water rights interests of those tribes that were
 19 intended to be satisfied with water supplied from the
 20 Animas-La Plata Project.
