3 **SECTION 2001. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This division may be cited as the “Military Construc-
5 tion Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 1998”.

 18 be appropriated for fiscal years beginning after September
 19 30, 1997, for military construction, land acquisition, and
 20 military family housing functions of the Department of the

(b) LIMITATION ON TOTAL COST OF CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS.—Notwithstanding the cost variations authorized by section 2853 of title 10, United States Code, and any other cost variation authorized by law, the total cost of all projects carried out under section 2101 of this Act may not exceed the total amount authorized to be appropriated under paragraphs (1) through (4) of subsection (a).
