A BILL

- 3 SECTION 1. EMERGENCY LIVESTOCK LOSS ASSISTANCE.
- 4 (a) In General.—The Secretary of Agriculture shall
- 5 provide a payment to a producer who certifies to the Sec-
- 6 retary that the producer has suffered at least a 5 percent
- 7 loss in the foundation herd (including dairy cattle), or at

- 1 least a 5 percent loss in the offspring of the foundation
- 2 herd, maintained by the producer as a result of damaging
- 3 weather or related condition occurring during the 1996–
- 4 97 winter season.

- 5 (b) Amount.—
- 6 (1) In General.—Except as otherwise pro-7 vided in this subsection, the amount of a payment 8 provided to a producer under this section shall equal 9 the product obtained by multiplying \$200 by 95 per-10 cent of the number of cattle of the producer, not to 11 exceed 200 cattle, that are lost as a result of damag-12 ing weather or related condition occurring during 13 the 1996–97 winter season.
 - (2) No double benefits.—The total amount of payments that a person shall be entitled to receive under this section and any insurance indemnity policy maintained by the person may not exceed the expected value of the lost cattle.
- 19 (c) ADMINISTRATION.—Except as otherwise provided 20 in this section, the terms and conditions of chapter 3 of 21 subtitle B of title XXII of the Food, Agriculture, Con-22 servation, and Trade Act of 1990 (Public Law 101–624) 23 (as in effect before the repeal of that chapter by section

119(c) of Public Law 103–354 (108 Stat. 3208)) shall

- 1 apply to payments made under this section to the extent
- 2 determined appropriate by the Secretary.
- 3 (d) Funding.—Notwithstanding sections 251 and
- 4 252 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Con-
- 5 trol Act of 1985 (2 U.S.C. 901, 902)—
- 6 (1) amounts and uses of funds made available
- 7 under this section are designated as emergency re-
- 8 quirements pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of

- 10 (2) the funds and uses shall be available only
 11 to the extent that the President submits to Congress
 12 an official budget request for a specific dollar
 13 amount, and designates the entire amount of the re14 quest as an emergency requirement pursuant to that
