A BILL

For the relief of Ching-hsun Sun and Ching-jou Sun.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.
- 4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for pur-
- 5 poses of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 6 1101 et seq.), Ching-hsun Sun and Ching-jou Sun shall
- 7 be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to
- 8 the United States for permanent residence as of the date
- 9 of the enactment of this Act upon payment of the required
- 10 visa fees.

1 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.

- 2 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Ching-
- 3 hsun Sun and Ching-jou Sun as provided in this Act, the
- 4 Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer to re-
- 5 duce by the appropriate number during the current fiscal
- 6 year the total number of immigrant visas available to na-
- 7 tives of the country of the aliens' birth under section
- 8 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 9 1153(a)).
