To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the bicentennial of the Library of Congress.

Mr. Stevens introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs

A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the bicentennial of the Library of Congress.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Library of Congress
- 5 Bicentennial Commemorative Coin Act of 1997".
- 6 SEC. 2. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.
- 7 (a) Denominations.—The Secretary of the Treas-
- 8 ury (hereafter in this Act referred to as the "Secretary")
- 9 shall mint and issue the following coins:

1	(1) \$5 GOLD COINS.—Not more than 100,000
2	\$5 coins, which shall—
3	(A) weigh 8.359 grams;
4	(B) have a diameter of 0.850 inches; and
5	(C) contain 90 percent gold and 10 percent
6	alloy.
7	(2) \$1 SILVER COINS.—Not more than 500,000
8	\$1 coins, which shall—
9	(A) weigh 26.73 grams;
10	(B) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and
11	(C) contain 90 percent silver and 10 per-
12	cent copper.
13	(b) Platinum Coins.—The Secretary may mint and
14	issue not more than 100,000 \$5 platinum coins instead
15	of the gold coins required under subsection $(a)(1)$ in ac-
16	cordance with such specifications as the Secretary deter-
17	mines to be appropriate.
18	(c) Legal Tender.—The coins minted under this
19	Act shall be legal tender, as provided in section 5103 of
20	title 31, United States Code.
21	(d) Numismatic Items.—For purposes of section
22	5134 of title 31, United States Code, all coins minted
23	under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic items.

1 SEC. 3. SOURCES OF BULLION.

- 2 (a) Gold.—The Secretary shall obtain gold for mint-
- 3 ing coins under this Act pursuant to the authority of the
- 4 Secretary under other provisions of law.
- 5 (b) SILVER.—The Secretary shall obtain silver for
- 6 minting coins under this Act only from stockpiles estab-
- 7 lished under the Strategic and Critical Materials Stock
- 8 Piling Act.

9 SEC. 4. DESIGN OF COINS.

- 10 (a) Design Requirements.—
- 11 (1) IN GENERAL.—The design of the coins
- minted under this Act shall be emblematic of the Li-
- brary of Congress.
- 14 (2) Designation and inscriptions.—On
- each coin minted under this Act there shall be—
- 16 (A) a designation of the value of the coin;
- 17 (B) an inscription of the year "2000"; and
- 18 (C) inscriptions of the words "Liberty",
- "In God We Trust", "United States of Amer-
- ica", and "E Pluribus Unum".
- 21 (b) Selection.—The design for the coins minted
- 22 under this Act shall be—
- 23 (1) selected by the Secretary after consultation
- 24 with the Library of Congress and the Commission of
- 25 Fine Arts; and

1	(2) reviewed by the Citizens Commemorative
2	Coin Advisory Committee.
3	SEC. 5. ISSUANCE OF COINS.
4	(a) QUALITY OF COINS.—Coins minted under this
5	Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities.
6	(b) MINT FACILITY.—Only 1 facility of the United
7	States Mint may be used to strike any particular combina-
8	tion of denomination and quality of the coins minted under
9	this Act.
10	(c) Period for Issuance.—The Secretary may
11	issue coins minted under this Act only during the period
12	beginning on January 1, 2000, and ending on December
13	31, 2000.
14	(d) Promotion Consultation.—The Secretary
15	shall—
16	(1) consult with the Library of Congress in
17	order to establish a role for the Library of Congress
18	in the promotion, advertising, and marketing of the
19	coins minted under this Act; and
20	(2) if the Secretary determines that such action
21	would be beneficial to the sale of coins minted under
22	this Act, enter into a contract with the Library of
23	Congress to carry out the role established under
24	paragraph (1).

SEC. 6. SALE OF COINS.

- 2 (a) Sale Price.—The coins issued under this Act
- 3 shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the sum
- 4 of—
- 5 (1) the face value of the coins;
- 6 (2) the surcharge provided in subsection (d)
- 7 with respect to such coins; and
- 8 (3) the cost of designing and issuing the coins
- 9 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery,
- overhead expenses, marketing, and shipping).
- 11 (b) Bulk Sales.—The Secretary shall make bulk
- 12 sales of the coins issued under this Act at a reasonable
- 13 discount.
- (c) Prepaid Orders.—
- 15 (1) In General.—The Secretary shall accept
- prepaid orders for the coins minted under this Act
- before the issuance of such coins.
- 18 (2) DISCOUNT.—Sale prices with respect to pre-
- paid orders under paragraph (1) shall be at a rea-
- sonable discount.
- 21 (d) Surcharges.—All sales shall include a sur-
- 22 charge established by the Secretary, in an amount equal
- 23 to not more than—
- 24 (1) \$35 per coin for the \$5 coin; and
- 25 (2) \$5 per coin for the \$1 coin.

1 SEC. 7. GENERAL WAIVER OF PROCUREMENT REGULA-

- 2 TIONS.
- 3 (a) In General.—Except as provided in subsection
- 4 (b), no provision of law governing procurement or public
- 5 contracts shall be applicable to the procurement of goods
- 6 and services necessary for carrying out the provisions of
- 7 this Act.
- 8 (b) Equal Employment Opportunity.—Sub-
- 9 section (a) shall not relieve any person entering into a con-
- 10 tract under the authority of this Act from complying with
- 11 any law relating to equal employment opportunity.
- 12 SEC. 8. DISTRIBUTION OF SURCHARGES.
- 13 (a) In General.—All surcharges received by the
- 14 Secretary from the sale of coins issued under this Act shall
- 15 be promptly paid by the Secretary to the Library of Con-
- 16 gress Trust Fund Board, to be used for the purpose of
- 17 supporting bicentennial programs, educational outreach
- 18 activities (including schools and libraries), and other ac-
- 19 tivities of the Library of Congress.
- 20 (b) AUDITS.—The Comptroller General of the United
- 21 States shall have the right to examine such books, records,
- 22 documents, and other data of the Library of Congress
- 23 Trust Fund Board as may be related to the expenditures
- 24 of amounts paid under subsection (a).

1 SEC. 9. FINANCIAL ASSURANCES.

2	(a) No Net Cost to the Government.—The Sec-
3	retary shall take such actions as may be necessary to en-
4	sure that minting and issuing coins under this Act will
5	not result in any net cost to the United States Govern-
6	ment.
7	(b) PAYMENT FOR COINS.—A coin shall not be issued
8	under this Act unless the Secretary has received—
9	(1) full payment for the coin;
10	(2) security satisfactory to the Secretary to in-
11	demnify the United States for full payment; or
12	(3) a guarantee of full payment satisfactory to

(3) a guarantee of full payment satisfactory to the Secretary from a depository institution whose deposits are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or the National Credit Union Administration Board.
