A BILL

To amend the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act to provide assistance to local educational agencies in cases of certain disasters, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. ASSISTANCE FOR LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGEN-
- 4 CIES IN CASES OF CERTAIN DISASTERS.
- 5 The Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emer-
- 6 gency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.) is amended
- 7 by adding at the end the following:

1	"TITLE VIII—ASSISTANCE FOR
2	LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGEN-
3	CIES IN CASES OF CERTAIN

5	"SEC. 801. ASSISTANCE FOR LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGEN-
6	CIES IN CASES OF CERTAIN DISASTERS.
7	"(a) Assistance.—
8	"(1) Authority.—The Director of the Federal
9	Emergency Management Agency may provide the as-
10	sistance described in paragraph (2) in any case in
11	which the Director determines with respect to any
12	local educational agency (including for the purpose
13	of this section any other public agency which oper-
14	ates schools providing technical, vocational, or other
15	special education to children of elementary school or
16	secondary school age) that—
17	"(A) the agency serves in whole or in part
18	an area with respect to which a major disaster
19	has been declared by the President under sec-
20	tion 401;
21	"(B) the Governor of the State in which
22	the agency is located has certified the need for
23	disaster assistance under this section, and has
24	given assurance of expenditure of a reasonable
25	amount of the funds of the government of the

State, or of any political subdivision thereof, for the same or similar purposes with respect to the disaster;

"(C) the agency is utilizing or will utilize all State and other financial assistance available to the agency for the purpose of meeting the cost of providing free public education for the children attending the schools of the agency, but as a result of the disaster the agency is unable to obtain sufficient funds for such purpose and requires an amount of additional assistance equal to at least \$10,000 or 5 percent of the agency's current expenditures during the fiscal year preceding the fiscal year in which the disaster occurred, whichever is less; and

"(D) in the case of any such disaster to the extent that the operation of private elementary schools and secondary schools in the school attendance area of such local educational agency has been disrupted or impaired by the disaster, the local educational agency has made provisions for the conduct of educational programs under public auspices and administration in which children enrolled in the private elementary schools and secondary schools may attend

1	and participate, except that nothing contained
2	in this section shall be construed to authorize
3	the making of any payment under this section
4	for religious worship or instruction.
5	"(2) Assistance.—The assistance referred to

- "(2) Assistance.—The assistance referred to in paragraph (1) is the assistance the Director determines necessary to pay the costs of emergency operating expenses incurred by the local educational agency in educating students in public and private elementary schools and secondary schools who have been displaced by the disaster, including—
 - "(A) providing transportation costs for busing students to alternative sites;
 - "(B) replacing instructional and maintenance supplies, equipment, and materials (including textbooks) destroyed or seriously damaged as a result of the disaster, making minor repairs, and leasing or otherwise providing (other than by acquisition of land or erection of facilities) school and cafeteria facilities needed to replace temporarily the facilities which have been made unavailable as a result of the disaster; and
 - "(C) providing educational services to children who, as a result of damage to schools that

the children attended prior to the disaster, were required to attend other schools.

- "(3) DURATION.—The Director may provide a local educational agency with assistance under this section for the period beginning on the date the disaster is declared by the President under section 401 with respect to an area served by the local educational agency and ending 18 months after the date.
- "(4) 10 PAYMENTS TO OTHER LOCAL EDU-11 CATIONAL AGENCIES.—A local educational agency 12 may use funds received under this section to make 13 a payment to another local educational agency for 14 the costs of emergency operating expenses incurred 15 by such other local educational agency in educating 16 students who are displaced by the disaster.
- "(b) Authorization of Appropriations.—There is authorized to be appropriated for each fiscal year such amounts as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this section. Pending such appropriation, the Director is authorized to expend (without regard for subchapter II of chapter 15 of title 31, United States Code) from any funds appropriated to the Federal Emergency Management Agency and at that time available to the Director, such sums as may be necessary for providing immediate

- 1 assistance under this section. Expenditures pursuant to
- 2 the preceding sentence—
- 3 "(1) shall be reported by the Director to the
- 4 Committees on Appropriations and Education and
- 5 the Workplace of the House of Representatives and
- 6 the Committees on Appropriations and Labor and
- 7 Human Resources of the Senate within 30 days of
- 8 the expenditure; and
- 9 "(2) shall be reimbursed from the appropria-
- tions authorized by the first sentence of this sub-
- section.
- 12 "(c) Report.—The report required under subsection
- 13 (b)(1) shall constitute a budget estimate within the mean-
- 14 ing of section 1109 of title 31, United States Code.
- 15 "(d) Application.—No payment may be made to
- 16 any local educational agency under this section except
- 17 upon application therefor which is submitted through the
- 18 appropriate State educational agency and is filed with the
- 19 Director in accordance with the regulations prescribed by
- 20 the Director. In determining the order in which such appli-
- 21 cations shall be approved, the Director shall consider the
- 22 relative educational and financial needs of the local edu-
- 23 cational agencies which have submitted approvable appli-
- 24 cations. The Director shall complete action of approval or

- 1 disapproval of an application within 90 days of the filing
- 2 of an application.
- 3 "(e) Payments.—Amounts paid by the Director to
- 4 local educational agencies under this section may be paid
- 5 in advance or by way of reimbursement and in such in-
- 6 stallments as the Director may determine. Any funds paid
- 7 to a local educational agency and not expended or other-
- 8 wise used for the purposes for which paid shall be repaid
- 9 to the Treasury of the United States.
- 10 "(f) Special Rule.—Funds available to carry out
- 11 this section for any fiscal year shall also be available to
- 12 carry out section 403 with respect to assistance for public
- 13 and private elementary schools and secondary schools.
- 14 "(g) Bureau Funded Schools.—The Director
- 15 may provide assistance to the Bureau of Indian Affairs
- 16 for Bureau funded schools that are located in an area with
- 17 respect to which a major disaster has been declared by
- 18 the President under section 401 in a manner similar to
- 19 the manner in which local educational agencies receive as-
- 20 sistance under this section.
- 21 "(h) Definitions.—In this section:
- 22 "(1) Bureau funded school.—The term
- 'Bureau funded school' has the meaning given the
- term in section 1146 of the Education Amendments
- 25 of 1978 (25 U.S.C. 2026).

1	"(2) Current expenditures.—The term
2	'current expenditures' has the meaning given the
3	term in section 8013 of the Elementary and Second-
4	ary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7713).

5 "(3) DIRECTOR.—The term 'Director' means 6 Director of the Federal Emergency Management 7 Agency.

"(4) ELEMENTARY SCHOOL; SECONDARY SCHOOL; LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCY; STATE EDUCATIONAL AGENCY.—The terms 'elementary school', 'secondary school', 'local educational agency', and 'State educational agency' have the meanings given the terms in section 14101 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 8801)."
