# A BILL

To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to authorize Presidential Honors Scholarships to be awarded to all students who graduate in the top five percent of their secondary school graduating class, to promote and recognize high academic achievement in secondary school, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Presidential Honors
- 5 Scholarship Act of 1997".

#### 1 SEC. 2. PRESIDENTIAL HONORS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

- 2 Part A of title IV of the Higher Education Act of
- 3 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1070 et seq.) is amended—
- 4 (1) by amending the heading for subpart 7 to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 "Subpart 7—Presidential Honors Scholarship Program";
- 7 and
- 8 (2) by inserting immediately before subpart 8
- 9 (20 U.S.C. 1070f et seq.) the following:
- 10 "SEC. 420A. PRESIDENTIAL HONORS SCHOLARSHIP PRO-
- 11 GRAM.
- 12 "(a) Purpose.—It is the purpose of this subpart to
- 13 establish a Presidential Honors Scholarship program to
- 14 encourage high academic achievement in public and pri-
- 15 vate secondary schools and to recognize and reward the
- 16 achievement of the outstanding graduates of such schools.
- 17 "(b) Program Authority.—The Secretary is au-
- 18 thorized, in accordance with this subpart, to carry out a
- 19 program of recognizing high academic achievement in pub-
- 20 lie and private secondary schools by awarding scholarships
- 21 to all students who graduate in the top five percent of
- 22 their secondary school graduating class, and thereby en-
- 23 couraging students to excel in their secondary school stud-
- 24 ies and pursue postsecondary education.
- 25 "(c) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
- 26 are authorized to be appropriated \$130,000,000 for fiscal

1	year 1998, and such sums as may be necessary for each
2	of the four succeeding fiscal years, to carry out this sub-
3	part. Funds appropriated pursuant to the authority of the
4	preceding sentence shall remain available for obligation
5	until the last day of the fourth fiscal year immediately suc-
6	ceeding the fiscal year for which such funds are appro-
7	priated.
8	"(d) Terms of Scholarships.—
9	"(1) Amount of scholarship.—
10	"(A) In general.—The amount of a
11	scholarship awarded under this subpart shall be
12	\$1,000.
13	"(B) Reduction.—Notwithstanding sub-
14	paragraph (A), if funds available in a fiscal
15	year are insufficient to fully fund all scholar-
16	ships under this subpart for such year, the
17	amount paid to each student under this subpart
18	for such year shall be reduced proportionately
19	"(C) Special rules.—Notwithstanding
20	any other provision in this title, a scholarship
21	awarded under this subpart—
22	"(i) shall not be counted in determin-
23	ing the student's need for grant, loan, or
24	work assistance under this title; and

1	"(ii) may, alone or in combination
2	with other grant, loan, or work assistance
3	received under this title, exceed the stu-
4	dent's cost of attendance, as defined in
5	section 472.

"(2) Period of scholarships.—A student who satisfies the requirements of subsection (f) may receive a scholarship under this subpart for a period of not more than one academic year of postsecondary education or training on at least a half-time basis, as determined by the institution.

## "(3) Scholarship Proceeds.—

"(A) USE AND AVAILABILITY.—Scholar-ship proceeds shall be used for the scholarship recipient's first year of postsecondary education or training, and shall remain available for such use for not more than three academic years following the student's graduation from secondary school.

"(B) DISBURSAL.—Scholarship proceeds shall be disbursed on behalf of students who receive scholarships under this subpart to the institutions of higher education at which the students are enrolled. No scholarship proceeds shall be disbursed on behalf of a student until

the student is enrolled at an institution of higher education on at least a half-time basis, as determined by such institution.

"(4) USE AT ANY INSTITUTION PERMITTED.—
A scholarship awarded under this subpart may be used to attend any institution of higher education, as defined in section 481.

# "(e) SELECTION OF SCHOLARS.—

- "(1) In General.—Scholarships under this subpart shall be awarded to all students who rank in the top five percent of the graduating class of each secondary school that participates in the program under this subpart. Ranking procedures shall be established by each such school, but may not include any nonacademic or extracurricular factors.
- "(2) Annual announcement of scholarsships.—Each participating secondary school shall
  announce the availability of scholarships under this
  subpart, and its selection procedures, to all students
  in the school, and their parents, at the beginning of
  each academic year.
- "(3) Records.—Each participating school shall maintain records of its selection procedures, the names of the students selected, and such other related information as the Secretary may require.

- "(f) STUDENT ELIGIBILITY.—In order to receive a 1 2 scholarship under this subpart, a student shall— 3 "(1) rank in the top five percent of the grad-4 uating class at the secondary school that the student 5 attends, as established by such school in accordance 6 with subsection (e); and 7 "(2) meet the requirements of section 484. "(g) Recognition of Scholarship Receipt.— 8 9 "(1) Designation of scholarship recipi-10 ENTS.—Students awarded scholarships under this 11 subpart shall be known as 'Presidential Honors 12 Scholars'. 13 "(2) Certificates; ceremonies.—The Sec-14 retary shall provide each student awarded a scholar-15 ship under this subpart a certificate from the Presi-16 dent that indicates that the recipient is a Presi-17 dential Honors Scholar. The certificate shall be pro-18 vided through the secondary school that selected the 19 student. The school may present the certificate in an 20 appropriate ceremony. 21 "(h) EVALUATION.—The Secretary shall, from time
- to time, conduct an evaluation of the program authorized
- 23 by this subpart.
- "(i) SECRETARIAL AUTHORITY.—In order to carry 24
- out the purposes of this subpart, the Secretary may, from

- 1 time to time, establish policies, procedures, and require-
- 2 ments, set deadlines, and require information.".
