Mr. Robb introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

## A BILL

To provide for the adjudication and payment of certain claims against the Government of Iraq.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PAYMENT OF IRAQI CLAIMS.
- 4 (a) Vesting of Assets.—All nondiplomatic ac-
- 5 counts of the Government of Iraq in the United States
- 6 that have been blocked pursuant to the International
- 7 Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 et
- 8 seq.) shall vest in the President, and the President, not
- 9 later than 30 days after the date of the enactment of this
- 10 Act, shall liquidate such accounts. Amounts from such liq-

- 1 uidation shall be transferred into the Iraq Claims Fund
- 2 established under subsection (b).
- 3 (b) Iraq Claims Fund.—Upon the vesting of ac-
- 4 counts under subsection (a), the Secretary of the Treasury
- 5 shall establish in the Treasury of the United States a fund
- 6 to be known as the Iraq Claims Fund (hereafter in this
- 7 section referred to as the "Fund") for payment of private
- 8 claims or United States Government claims in accordance
- 9 with subsection (c).

## 10 (c) Payments.—

(1) Payments on private claims.—Not later than 2 years after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Treasury shall make payment out of the Fund in ratable proportions on private claims certified under subsection (e) according to the proportions which the total amount of the private claims so certified bear to the total amount in the Fund that is available for distribution at the

time such payments are made.

(2) PAYMENTS ON UNITED STATES GOVERN-MENT CLAIMS.—After payment has been made in full out of the Fund on all private claims certified under subsection (e), any funds remaining in the Fund shall be made available to satisfy claims of the

- 1 United States Government against the Government
- 2 of Iraq determined under subsection (d).
- 3 (d) Determination of Validity of United
- 4 States Government Claims.—The President shall de-
- 5 termine the validity and amounts of claims of the Govern-
- 6 ment of the United States against the Government of Iraq
- 7 which the Secretary of State has determined are outside
- 8 the jurisdiction of the United Nations Commission, and,
- 9 to the extent that such claims are not satisfied from funds
- 10 made available by the Fund, the President is authorized
- 11 and requested to enter into a settlement agreement with
- 12 the Government of Iraq which would provide for the pay-
- 13 ment of such unsatisfied claims.
- (e) Determination of Private Claims.—
- 15 (1) Authority of the foreign claims set-
- 16 TLEMENT COMMISSION.—The Foreign Claims Settle-
- ment Commission of the United States is authorized
- to receive and determine, in accordance with sub-
- stantive law, including international law, the validity
- and amounts of private claims under this section.
- The Commission shall complete its affairs in connec-
- 22 tion with the determination of private claims under
- 23 this section within such time as is necessary to allow
- the payment of the claims under subsection (c)(1).

- 1 (2) APPLICABILITY.—Except to the extent in2 consistent with the provisions of this section, the
  3 provisions of title I of the International Claims Set4 tlement Act of 1949 (22 U.S.C. 1621 et seq.) shall
  5 apply with respect to private claims under this sec6 tion. Any reference in such provisions to "this title"
  7 shall be deemed to refer to those provisions and to
  8 this section.
- 9 (3) CERTIFICATION.—The Foreign Claims Set-10 tlement Commission shall certify to the Secretary of 11 the Treasury the awards made in favor of each pri-12 vate claim under paragraph (1).
- 13 (f) Unsatisfied Claims.—Payment of any award
  14 made pursuant to this section shall not extinguish any
  15 unsatisfied claim, or be construed to have divested any
  16 claimant, or the United States on his or her behalf, of
  17 any rights against the Government of Iraq with respect
  18 to any unsatisfied claim.
- 19 (g) Definitions.—As used in this section—
- 20 (1) the term "Government of Iraq" includes 21 agencies, instrumentalities, and controlled entities 22 (including public sector enterprises) of that govern-23 ment;
- 24 (2) the term "private claims" mean claims of 25 United States persons against the Government of

1	Iraq that are determined by the Secretary of State
2	to be outside the jurisdiction of the United Nations
3	Commission;
4	(3) the term "United Nations Commission"
5	means the United Nations Compensation Commis-
6	sion established pursuant to United Nations Secu-
7	rity Council Resolution 687, adopted in 1991; and
8	(4) the term "United States person"—
9	(A) includes—
10	(i) any person, wherever located, who
11	is a citizen of the United States;
12	(ii) any corporation, partnership, asso-
13	ciation, or other legal entity organized
14	under the laws of the United States or of
15	any State, the District of Columbia, or any
16	commonwealth, territory, or possession of
17	the United States; and
18	(iii) any corporation, partnership, as-
19	sociation, or other organization, wherever
20	organized or doing business, which is
21	owned or controlled by persons described
22	in clause (i) or (ii); and
23	(B) does not include the United States
24	Government or any officer or employee of the

- 1 United States Government acting in an official
- 2 capacity.
