A BILL

To establish an Office on Women's Health within the Department of Health and Human Services.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Women's Health Office
- 5 Act of 1997".
- 6 SEC. 2. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES OFFICE ON WOM-
- 7 EN'S HEALTH.
- 8 Part A of title II of the Public Health Service Act
- 9 (42 U.S.C. 202 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
- 10 the following:

1	"SEC. 229. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES OFFICE ON
2	WOMEN'S HEALTH.
3	"(a) Establishment of Office.—There is estab-
4	lished within the Office of the Secretary an Office on
5	Women's Health (hereafter referred to in this section as
6	the 'Office'). The Office on Women's Health shall be head-
7	ed by a Deputy Assistant Secretary for Women's Health.
8	"(b) Duties.—The Office shall, with respect to the
9	health concerns of women—
10	"(1) establish short-range and long-range goals
11	and objectives and coordinate all activities within the
12	Department of Health and Human Services that re-
13	late to disease prevention, health promotion, service
14	delivery, research, and public and health care profes-
15	sional education concerning women;
16	"(2) provide expert advice and consultation to
17	the Secretary concerning scientific, legal ethical, and
18	policy issues relating to women's health;
19	"(3) monitor the Department of Health and
20	Human Services offices, agencies, and regional ac-
21	tivities regarding women's health and coordinate and
22	stimulate activities of such departmental and agency
23	offices on women's health;
24	"(4) establish a Department of Health and
25	Human Services Coordinating Committee on Wom-
26	en's Health to be chaired by the Deputy Assistant

1	Secretary for Women's Health which shall be com-
2	posed of senior level representatives from each of the
3	agencies and offices of the Department of Health
4	and Human Services;
5	"(5) establish a National Women's Health In-
6	formation Center to—
7	"(A) facilitate the exchange of information
8	regarding matters relating to health informa-
9	tion and health promotion, preventive health
10	services, research advances, and education in
11	the appropriate use of health care;
12	"(B) facilitate access to such information
13	"(C) assist in the analysis of issues and
14	problems relating to the matters described in
15	this paragraph; and
16	"(D) provide technical assistance with re-
17	spect to the exchange of information (including
18	facilitating the development of materials for
19	such technical assistance);
20	"(6) coordinate efforts to promote women's
21	health programs and policies in the private sector
22	and
23	"(7) through publications and any other means
24	appropriate, provide for the exchange of information

- 2 fice, and the general public.
- 3 "(c) Grants and Contracts Regarding Du-
- 4 TIES.—
- 5 "(1) AUTHORITY.—In carrying out subsection
- 6 (b), the Secretary, acting through the Office, may
- 7 make grants to, and enter into cooperative agree-
- 8 ments, contracts, and interagency agreements with
- 9 public and nonprofit private entities, agencies, and
- organizations.
- 11 "(2) EVALUATION AND DISSEMINATION.—The
- Office shall directly or through contracts with public
- and private entities, agencies, and organization, pro-
- vide for evaluations of projects carried out with fi-
- nancial assistance provided under paragraph (1) and
- 16 for the dissemination of information developed as a
- 17 result of such projects.
- 18 "(d) Reports.—Not later than January 31, 1998,
- 19 and January 31 of each second year thereafter, the Sec-
- 20 retary shall prepare and submit to the appropriate com-
- 21 mittees of Congress a report describing the activities car-

- 23 the report is being prepared.
- 24 "(e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For the
- 25 purpose of carrying out this section, there are authorized

- 1 to be appropriated such sums as may be necessary for
- 2 each of the fiscal years 1998 through 2001.
- 3 "(f) Transfer.—There are transferred to the Office,
- 4 all functions exercised by the Office on Women's Health
- 5 of the Public Health Service prior to the date of enactment
- 6 of this section, including all personnel and compensation
- 7 authority, all delegation and assignment authority, and all
- 8 remaining appropriations. All orders, determinations,
- 9 rules, regulations, permits, agreements, grants, contracts,
- 10 certificates, licenses, registrations, privileges, and other
- 11 administrative actions—
- "(1) which have been issued, made, granted, or
- allowed to become effective by the President, any
- 14 Federal agency or official thereof, or by a court of
- 15 competent jurisdiction, in the performance of func-
- tions which are transferred under this subsection;

- 18 "(2) which are in effect at the time this section
- takes effect, or were final before the date of enact-
- 20 ment of this section and are to become effective on
- or after such date;
- 22 shall continue in effect according to their terms until
- 23 modified, terminated, superseded, set aside, or revoked in

2	retary for Women's Health or other authorized official, a	
3	court of competent jurisdiction, or by operation of law.".	
4	SEC. 3. CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVEN-	
5	TION OFFICE OF WOMEN'S HEALTH.	
6	Part A of title III of the Public Health Service Act	
7	(42 U.S.C. 241 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end	
8	3 the following:	
9	"CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION	
10	OFFICE OF WOMEN'S HEALTH	
11	"Sec. 310A. (a) Establishment.—There is estab-	
12	lished within the Office of the Director of the Centers for	
13	Disease Control and Prevention an office to be known as	
14	the Office of Women's Health (hereafter referred to in this	
15	5 section as the 'Office'). The Office shall be headed by	
16	director who shall be appointed by the Director of the	
17	Centers.	
18	"(b) Purpose.—The Director of the Office shall—	
19	"(1) determine the current level of the Centers	
20	activity regarding women's health conditions, across	
21	age, biological, and sociocultural contexts, in all as-

7	SEC. 4. AGENCY FOR HEALTH CARE POLICY AND RE-
8	SEARCH OFFICE OF WOMEN'S HEALTH.
9	Part C of title IX of the Public Health Service Act
10	(42 U.S.C. 299c et seq.) is amended—
11	(1) by redesignating section 927 as section 928;
12	and
13	(2) by inserting after section 926 the following:
14	"SEC. 927. OFFICE OF WOMEN'S HEALTH.
15	"(a) Establishment.—There is established within
16	the Office of the Director of the Agency for Health Care
17	Policy and Research an office to be known as the Office
18	of Women's Health (hereafter referred to in this section
19	as the 'Office'). The Office shall be headed by a Director
20	who shall be appointed by the Director of the Agency.
21	"(b) Purpose.—The Director of the Office shall—
22	"(1) determine the current Agency level of ac-
23	tivity regarding women's health, across age, biologi-
24	cal, and sociocultural contexts, in all aspects of
25	Agency work, including drafting clinical practice

 - "(4) consult with health professionals, nongovernmental organizations, consumer organizations, women's health professionals, and other individuals and groups, as appropriate, on Agency policy with regard to women; and
 - "(5) coordinate agency activities on women's health with the Office of Women's Health established under section 310A.

11	Resources and Services Administration an office to be
12	known as the Office of Women's Health (hereafter re-
13	ferred to in this section as the 'Office'). The Office shall
14	be headed by a director who shall be appointed by the Di-
15	rector of the Administration.
16	"(b) Purpose.—The Director of the Office shall—
17	"(1) determine the current agency level of activ-
18	ity regarding women's health across age, biological,
19	and sociocultural contexts;
20	"(2) establish short-range and long-range goals
21	and objectives for women's health and coordinate all
22	other activities within the agency that relate to
23	health care provider training, health service delivery,
24	research, and demonstration projects;
25	"(3) identify projects in women's health that
26	should be conducted or supported by the Bureaus;

2	ernmental organizations, consumer organizations,
3	women's health professionals, and other individuals

1 "SEC. 906. OFFICE OF WOMEN'S HEALTH.

2	"(a) Establishment.—There is established within
3	the Office of the Commissioner of the Food and Drug Ad-
4	ministration an office to be known as the Office of Wom-
5	en's Health (hereafter referred to in this section as the
6	'Office'). The Office shall be headed by a Director who
7	shall be appointed by the Commissioner of the Administra-
8	tion.
9	"(b) Purpose.—The Director of the Office shall—
10	"(1) determine current Commission levels of ac-
11	tivity regarding women's participation in clinical
12	trials the study of gender differences in the testing
13	of drugs, medical devices, and biological products,
14	across, age, sociocultural, and, where deemed appro-
15	priate, biological contexts;
16	"(2) establish short-range and long-range goals
17	and objectives for adequate inclusion of women in all
18	Commission protocols and policies;
19	"(3) provide guidance or criteria for drug and
20	device manufacturers to use in determining the ex-
21	tent and sufficiency of female representation in clini-
22	cal trials;
23	"(4) consult with pharmaceutical manufactur-
24	ers, health professionals with expertise in women's
25	issues, consumer organizations, and women's health

1	professionals on Commission policy with regard to
2	women;
3	"(5) make annual estimates of funds needed to
4	monitor clinical trials in accordance with needs that
5	are identified; and

10	"(c) Coordinating Committee.—

8	"(C) maintaining the Commission's focus
9	in areas of importance to women;
10	"(D) supporting the development of meth-
11	odologies to determine the circumstances in
12	which obtaining data specific to women (includ-
13	ing data relating to the age of women and the
14	membership of women in ethnic or racial
15	groups) is an appropriate function of clinical
16	trials of treatments and therapies;
17	"(E) supporting the development and ex-
18	pansion of clinical trials of treatments and
19	therapies for which obtaining such data has
20	been determined to be an appropriate function;
21	and
22	"(F) encouraging the Food and Drug Ad-
23	ministration Centers to conduct and support
24	such studies, including such clinical trials.

- 2 and January 31 of each second year thereafter, the Direc-
- 3 tor shall prepare and submit to the Director of the Office
- 4 on Women's Health established under section 229 of the
- 5 Public Health Service Act, a report describing the activi-
- 6 ties carried out under this section during the preceding

7 2 fiscal years.".

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
