A BILL

For the relief of Pyonghui Gonion Arrington.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.
- 4 In the administration of the Immigration and Nation-
- 5 ality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.), Pyonghui Gonion
- 6 Arrington shall be held and considered to have been law-
- 7 fully admitted to the United States for permanent resi-
- 8 dence as of the date of the enactment of this Act upon
- 9 payment of the required visa fees.
- 10 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.
- 11 Upon the granting of permanent residence to
- 12 Pyonghui Gonion Arrington as provided in this Act, the

- 1 Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer to re-
- 2 duce by one number during the current fiscal year the
- 3 total number of immigrant visas available to natives of the
- 4 country of the alien's birth under subsection (a) of section
- 5 203 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
