Mr. Warner (for himself, Ms. Mikulski, Mr. Robb, and Mr. Sarbanes) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To simplify and consolidate the pay system for the United States Secret Service Uniformed Division, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. RATES OF BASIC PAY FOR THE UNITED STATES
- 4 SECRET SERVICE UNIFORMED DIVISION.
- 5 (a) New Rates of Basic Pay.—Section 501 of the
- 6 District of Columbia Police and Firemen's Salary Act of
- 7 1958, (District of Columbia Code, section 4–416), is
- 8 amended—

1	(1) in subsection (b)(1), by striking "Interior"
2	and all that follows through "Treasury," and insert-
3	ing "Interior";
4	(2) by redesignating subsection (c) as sub-
5	section (b)(3);
6	(3) in subsection (b)(3) (as redesignated)—
7	(A) by striking "or to officers and mem-
8	bers of the United States Secret Service Uni-
9	formed Division"; and
10	(B) by striking "subsection (b) of this sec-
11	tion" and inserting "this subsection"; and
12	(4) by adding after subsection (b) the following
13	new subsection:
14	"(c)(1) The annual rates of basic compensation of of-
15	ficers and members of the United States Secret Service
16	Uniformed Division, serving in classes corresponding or
17	similar to those in the salary schedule in section 101 (Dis-
18	trict of Columbia Code, section 4–406), shall be fixed in
19	accordance with the following schedule of rates:

- 1 "(2) Effective at the beginning of the first applicable
- 2 pay period commencing on or after the first day of the
- 3 month in which an adjustment takes effect under section
- 4 5303 of title 5, United States Code (or any subsequent
- 5 similar provision of law), in the rates of pay under the
- 6 General Schedule (or any pay system that may supersede
- 7 such schedule), the annual rates of basic compensation of
- 8 officers and members of the United States Secret Service
- 9 Uniformed Division shall be adjusted by the Secretary of
- 10 the Treasury by an amount equal to the percentage of
- 11 such annual rate of pay which corresponds to the overall
- 12 percentage of the adjustment made in the rates of pay
- 13 under the General Schedule.
- 14 "(3) Locality-based comparability payments author-
- 15 ized under section 5304 of title 5, United States Code,
- 16 shall be applicable to the basic pay under this section, ex-
- 17 cept locality-based comparability payments may not be
- 18 paid at a rate which, when added to the rate of basic pay
- 19 otherwise payable to the officer or member, would cause
- 20 the total to exceed the rate of basic pay payable for level
- 21 IV of the Executive Schedule.
- 22 "(4) Pay may not be paid, by reason of any provision
- 23 of this subsection (disregarding any comparability pay-
- 24 ment payable under Federal law), at a rate in excess of
- 25 the rate of basic pay payable for level V of the Executive

- 1 Schedule contained in subchapter II of chapter 53 of title
- 2 5, United States Code.
- 3 "(5) Any reference in any law to the salary schedule
- 4 in section 101 (District of Columbia Code, section 4–406)
- 5 with respect to officers and members of the United States
- 6 Secret Service Uniformed Division shall be considered to
- 7 be a reference to the salary schedule in paragraph (1) of
- 8 this subsection as adjusted in accordance with this sub-
- 9 section.
- 10 "(6)(A) Except as otherwise permitted by or under
- 11 law, no allowance, differential, bonus, award, or other
- 12 similar cash payment under this title or under title 5,
- 13 United States Code, may be paid to an officer or member
- 14 of the United States Secret Service Uniformed Division
- 15 in a calendar year if, or to the extent that, when added
- 16 to the total basic pay paid or payable to such officer or
- 17 member for service performed in such calendar year as
- 18 an officer or member, such payment would cause the total
- 19 to exceed the annual rate of basic pay payable for level
- 20 I of the Executive Schedule, as of the end of such calendar
- 21 year.
- 22 "(B) This paragraph shall not apply to any payment
- 23 under the following provisions of title 5, United States
- 24 Code:

"(i) Subchapter III or VII of chapter 55, or

2	section 5596.
3	"(ii) Chapter 57 (other than section 5753
4	5754, or 5755).
5	"(iii) Chapter 59 (other than section 5928).
6	"(7)(A) Any amount which is not paid to an officer
7	or member of the United States Secret Service Uniformed
8	Division in a calendar year because of the limitation under
9	paragraph (6) shall be paid to such officer or member in
10	a lump sum at the beginning of the following calendar
11	year.
12	"(B) Any amount paid under this paragraph in a cal-
13	endar year shall be taken into account for purposes of ap-
14	plying the limitations under paragraph (6) with respect
15	to such calendar year.
16	"(8) The Office of Personnel Management shall pre-
17	scribe regulations as may be necessary (consistent with
18	section 5582 of title 5, United States Code) concerning
19	how a lump-sum payment under paragraph (7) shall be
20	made with respect to any employee who dies before an
21	amount payable to such employee under paragraph (7) is
22	made.".
23	(b) Conversion to New Salary Schedule.—
24	(1)(A) Effective on the first day of the first pay
25	period beginning after the date of enactment of this

- section, the Secretary of the Treasury shall fix the rates of basic pay for members of the United States Secret Service Uniformed Division in accordance with this paragraph.
 - (B) Subject to subparagraph (C), each officer and member receiving basic compensation, immediately prior to the effective date of this section, at one of the scheduled rates in the salary schedule in section 101 of the District of Columbia Police and Firemen's Salary Act of 1958, as adjusted by law and as in effect prior to the effective date of this section, shall be placed in and receive basic compensation at the corresponding scheduled service step of the salary schedule under subsection (a)(4).
 - (C)(i) The Assistant Chief and the Chief of the United States Secret Service Uniformed Division shall be placed in and receive basic compensation in salary class 10 and salary class 11, respectively, in the appropriate service step in the new salary class in accordance with section 304 of the District of Columbia Police and Firemen's Salary Act 1958 (District of Columbia Code, section 4–413).
 - (ii) Each member whose position is to be converted to the salary schedule under section 501(c) of the District of Columbia Police and Firemen's Sal-

- ary Act of 1958 (District of Columbia Code, section
 4–416(c)) as amended by this section, in accordance
 with subsection (a) of this section, and who, prior to
 the effective date of this section has earned, but has
 not been credited with, an increase in his or her rate
 of pay shall be afforded that increase before such
 member is placed in the corresponding service step
 in the salary schedule under section 501(c).
 - (2) Except in the cases of the Assistant Chief and the Chief of the United States Secret Service Uniformed Division, the conversion of positions and individuals to appropriate classes of the salary schedule under section 501(c) of the District of Columbia Police and Firemen's Salary Act of 1958 (District of Columbia Code, section 4–416(c)) as amended by this section, and the initial adjustments of rates of basic pay of those positions and individuals, in accordance with paragraph (1) of this subsection, shall not be considered to be transfers or promotions within the meaning of section 304 of the District of Columbia Police and Firemen's Salary Act of 1958 (District of Columbia Code, section 4–413).
 - (3) Each member whose position is converted to the salary schedule under section 501(c) of the Dis-

- 1 trict of Columbia Police and Firemen's Salary Act of 2 1958 (District of Columbia Code, section 4-416(c)) 3 as amended by this section, in accordance with subsection (a) of this section, shall be granted credit for 5 purposes of such member's first service step adjust-6 ment under the salary schedule in such section 7 510(c) for all satisfactory service performed by the 8 member since the member's last increase in basic 9 pay prior to the adjustment under that section. 10 (c) Limitation on Pay Period Earnings.—The Act of August 15, 1950 (64 Stat. 477), (District of Co-11 12 lumbia Code, section 4–1104), is amended— 13 (1) in subsection (h), by striking "any officer or 14 member" each place it appears and inserting "an of-15 ficer or member of the Metropolitan Police force, of 16 the Fire Department of the District of Columbia, or 17 of the United States Park Police"; 18 (2) by redesignating subsection (h)(3) as sub-19
 - section (i); and
 - (3) by inserting after paragraph (2) the following new paragraph:
- 22 "(3)(A) no premium pay provided by this sec-23 tion shall be paid to, and no compensatory time is 24 authorized for, any officer or member of the United 25 States Secret Service Uniformed Division whose rate

4	"(i) 150 percent of the minimum rate pay-

12	"(ii) the rate payable for level V of the Ex-

14	chapter 53 of title 5, United States Code.
15	"(B) In the case of any officer or member of
16	the United States Secret Service Uniformed Division
17	whose rate of basic pay, combined with any applica-
18	ble locality-based comparability payment, is less than
19	the lesser of—
20	"(i) 150 percent of the minimum rate pay-
21	able for grade GS-15 of the General Schedule
22	(including any applicable locality-based com-
23	parability payment under section 5304 of title
24	5, United States Code or any similar provision

of law, and any applicable special rate of pay

1	under section 5305 of title 5, United States
2	Code or any similar provision of law); or
3	"(ii) the rate payable for level V of the Ex-
4	ecutive Schedule contained in subchapter II of
5	chapter 53 of title 5, United States Code,
6	such premium pay may be paid only to the extent
7	that such payment would not cause such officer or
8	member's aggregate rate of compensation to exceed
9	such lesser amount with respect to any pay period."
10	(d) Savings Provision.—On the effective date of
11	this section, any existing special salary rates authorized
12	for members of the United States Secret Service Uni-
13	formed Division under section 5305 of title 5, United
14	States Code (or any previous similar provision of law) and
15	any special rates of pay or special pay adjustments under
16	section 403, 404, or 405 of the Federal Law Enforcement
17	Pay Reform Act of 1990 applicable to members of the
18	United States Secret Service Uniformed Division shall be
19	rendered inapplicable.
20	(e) Conforming Amendment.—The Federal Law
21	Enforcement Pay Reform Act of 1990 (104 Stat. 1466)
22	is amended by striking subsections $(b)(1)$ and $(c)(1)$ of
23	section 405.

- 1 (f) Effective Date.—The provisions of this section
- 2 shall become effective on the first day of the first pay pe-

3 riod beginning after the date of enactment.
