  - 6 friendship with them and purchased land from them;

- 1 Whereas Roger Williams may also be seen as the first Eu-
- 2 ropean environmentalist on this continent; and
- 3 Whereas Roger Williams was the founder of the first Bap-
- 4 tist church in America and the founder of the first
- 5 Baptist denomination in this hemisphere: Now, there-
- 6 fore, be it
- 7 Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives
- 8 concurring), That the statue of Roger Williams shall be
- 9 returned to the United States Capitol Rotunda at the con-
- 10 clusion of the temporary display of the Suffragists Por-
- 11 trait Monument.
