## **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

Expressing the sense of the Congress that the Russian Federation should be strongly condemned for its plan to provide nuclear technology to Iran, and that such nuclear transfer would make Russia ineligible under terms of the Freedom Support Act.

- 3 (a) FINDINGS.—The Congress finds that—
- 4 (1) Iran is aggressively pursuing a program to
- 5 acquire and/or develop nuclear weapons;

- (2) the Director of Central Intelligence, in Sep-1 2 tember of 1994, confirmed that Iran is manufactur-3 ing and stockpiling chemical weapons; (3) Iran has opposed the Middle East peace 5 process and continues to support the terrorist group 6 Hezballah in Lebanon and radical Palestinian 7 groups; 8 (4) Iran has asserted control over the Persian 9 Gulf island of Abu Musa, which it had been pre-10 viously sharing with the United Arab Emirates; 11 (5) during the last few years Iran has report-12 edly acquired several hundred improved Scud mis-13 siles from North Korea: 14 (6) Iran has moved modern air defense missile 15 systems, tanks, additional troops, artillery, and sur-16 face-to-surface missiles onto islands in the Persian 17 Gulf, some of which are disputed between Iran and 18 the United Arab Emirates; 19
  - (7) Iran has already taken delivery of as many as thirty modern Mig-29 fighter aircraft from the Russian Federation;
  - (8) The Russian Federation has sold modern conventionally powered submarines to Iran, which increases Iran's capability to blockade the Straits of Hormuz and the Persian Gulf; and

1	(9) the Russian Federation continues to move
2	forward on implementing a commercial agreement to
3	provide Iran with critical nuclear technology despite
4	having been provided with detailed information by
5	the President of the United States on Iran's nuclear
6	weapons program in violation of the Nuclear Non-
7	Proliferation Treaty.

- 8 (b) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of Congress that—
  - (1) the Russian Federation should be strongly condemned for continuing to implement a commercial agreement to provide Iran with nuclear technology that could assist that country in its development of nuclear weapons, and
  - (2) the continued implementation of its commercial nuclear agreement with Iran makes the Russian Federation ineligible for United States economic assistance under the terms of the Freedom Support Act.
