Mr. MACK (for himself and Mr. DASCHLE) submitted the following resolution;
which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

To authorize printing of the minutes of the Senate
Republican and Democratic Party Conferences.

Whereas the Senate Republican and Democratic Conferences
have maintained minutes of their meetings since the ear-
liest years of this century;

Whereas the Advisory Committee on the Records of Congress
recommends that the portions of those minutes at least
30 years old be published; and

Whereas the minutes of the Senate Party Conferences offer
rich documentation of the Senate's institutional develop-
ment during the first two-thirds of the 20th century:
Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved,*

1 **SECTION 1. PRINTING OF THE MINUTES OF THE**
 2 **REPUBLICAN CONFERENCE, 1911–1964.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—There shall be printed as a Senate
 4 document the book entitled “Minutes of the Senate Re-
 5 publican Conference, 1911–1964”, prepared by the Senate
 6 Historical Office under the supervision of the Secretary
 7 of the Senate, with the concurrence of the United States
 8 Senate Republican Conference.

9 (b) SPECIFICATIONS.—The Senate document de-
 10 scribed in subsection (a) shall include illustrations and
 11 shall be in the style, form, manner, and binding as di-
 12 rected by the Joint Committee on Printing after consulta-
 13 tion with the Secretary of the Senate.

14 (c) NUMBER OF COPIES.—In addition to the usual
 15 number of copies, there shall be printed with suitable bind-
 16 ing the lesser of—

17 (1) 1,000 copies for use of the Senate, to be al-
 18 located as determined by the Secretary of the Sen-
 19 ate; or

20 (2) a number of copies that does not have a
 21 total production and printing cost of more than
 22 \$1,200.

23 **SEC. 2. PRINTING OF THE MINUTES OF THE DEMOCRATIC**
 24 **CONFERENCE, 1903–1964.**

25 (a) IN GENERAL.—There shall be printed as a Senate
 26 document the book entitled “Minutes of the Senate Demo-

1 cratic Conference, 1903–1964”, prepared by the Senate
2 Historical Office under the supervision of the Secretary
3 of the Senate, with the concurrence of the United States
4 Senate Democratic Conference.

5 (b) SPECIFICATIONS.—The Senate document de-
6 scribed in subsection (a) shall include illustrations and
7 shall be in the style, form, manner, and binding as di-
8 rected by the Joint Committee on Printing after consulta-
9 tion with the Secretary of the Senate.

10 (c) NUMBER OF COPIES.—In addition to the usual
11 number of copies, there shall be printed with suitable bind-
12 ing the lesser of—

13 (1) 1,000 copies for the use of the Senate, to
14 be allocated as determined by the Secretary of the
15 Senate; or

16 (2) a number of copies that does not have a
17 total production and printing cost of more than
18 \$1,200.
