Mr. BENNETT submitted the following resolution; which was considered and
agreed to

RESOLUTION

To make a technical amendment to Senate Resolution 208.

1 *Resolved*, That Senate Resolution 208, agreed to
2 April 2, 1998 (105th Congress), is amended—

3 (1) in section 3(a)(8), by inserting “reimburs-
4 able or” before “non-reimbursable”; and

5 (2) striking section 5 and inserting the follow-
6 ing:

7 **“SEC. 5. FUNDING.**

8 “(a) IN GENERAL.—There shall be made available
9 from the contingent fund of the Senate out of the Account
10 for Expenses for Inquiries and Investigations, for use by
11 the special committee to carry out this resolution—

1 “(1) not to exceed \$575,000 for the period be-
2 ginning on April 2, 1998, through February 28,
3 1999, and \$575,000 for the period beginning on
4 March 1, 1999, through February 29, 2000, of
5 which not to exceed \$200,000 shall be available for
6 each period for the procurement of the services of
7 individual consultants, or organizations thereof, as
8 authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reor-
9 ganization Act of 1946; and

10 “(2) such additional sums as may be necessary
11 for agency contributions related to the compensation
12 of employees of the special committee.

13 “(b) EXPENSES.—Payment of expenses of the special
14 committee shall be disbursed upon vouchers approved by
15 the chairman, except that vouchers shall not be required
16 for the disbursement of salaries paid at an annual rate.”.
