Mr. Shelby, from the Select Committee on Intelligence, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

## RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Select Committee on Intelligence.

- 1 Resolved, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
- 2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
- 3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
- 4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
- 5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
- 6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
- 7 the Committee on Intelligence is authorized from March
- 8 1, 1997, through February 28, 1998, and March 1, 1998,
- 9 through February 28, 1999, in its discretion (1) to make
- 10 expenditures from the contingent fund of the Senate, (2)

- 1 to employ personnel, and (3) with the prior consent of the
- 2 Government department or agency concerned and the
- 3 Committee on Rules and Administration, to use on a reim-
- 4 bursable or nonreimbursable basis the services of person-
- 5 nel of any such department or agency.
- 6 Sec. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
- 7 period March 1, 1997, through February 28, 1998, under
- 8 this resolution shall not exceed \$2,506,182, of which
- 9 amount not to exceed \$30,000 may be expended for the
- 10 procurement of the services of individual consultants, or
- 11 organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of
- 12 the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended).
- 13 (b) For the period March 1, 1998, through February
- 14 28, 1999, expenses of the committee under this resolution
- 15 shall not exceed \$2,574,036, of which amount not to ex-
- 16 ceed \$30,000 may be expended for the procurement of the
- 17 services of individual consultants, or organizations thereof
- 18 (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorga-
- 19 nization Act of 1946, as amended).
- 20 Sec. 3. The committee shall report is findings, to-
- 21 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
- 22 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
- 23 date, but not later than February 28, 1997, and February
- 24 28, 1998, respectively.

- 1 Sec. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
- 2 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
- 3 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-
- 4 tee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for the
- 5 disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an annual
- 6 rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
- 7 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
- 8 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of
- 9 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
- 10 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to
- 11 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
- 12 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
- 13 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
- 14 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
- 15 Recording and Photographic Services.
- 16 Sec. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
- 17 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
- 18 pensation of employees of the committee, from March 1,
- 19 1997, through February 28, 1998, and March 1, 1998,
- 20 through February 28, 1999, to be paid from the Appro-
- 21 priations account for "Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
- 22 tigations".
