# S. RES. 41

Authorizing expenditures by the Special Committee on Aging.

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IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

JANUARY 30, 1997

Mr. GRASSLEY reported the following original resolution; which was referred  
to the Committee on Rules and Administration

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## RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Special Committee on Aging.

1       *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and  
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-  
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such  
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,  
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1  
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,  
7 the Special Committee on Aging is authorized from March  
8 1, 1997, through February 28, 1998, and March 1, 1998,  
9 through February 28, 1999, in its discretion—

10           (1) to make expenditures from the contingent  
11 fund of the Senate,

12           (2) to employ personnel, and

1           (3) with the prior consent of the Government  
2       department or agency concerned and the Committee  
3       on Rules and Administration, to use on a reimburs-  
4       able or nonreimbursable basis the services of person-  
5       nel of any such department or agency.

6       SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the  
7       period March 1, 1997, through February 28, 1998, under  
8       this resolution shall not exceed \$1,133,674, of which  
9       amount not to exceed \$15,000 may be expended for the  
10      procurement of the services of individual consultants or  
11      organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of  
12      the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended).

13      (b) For the period March 1, 1998, through February  
14      28, 1999, expenses of the committee under this resolution  
15      shall not exceed \$1,162,865, of which amount not to ex-  
16      ceed \$15,000 may be expended for the procurement of the  
17      services of individual consultants or organizations thereof  
18      (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorga-  
19      nization Act of 1946, as amended).

20      SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-  
21      gether with such recommendations for legislation as it  
22      deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable  
23      date, but not later than February 28, 1998, and February  
24      28, 1999, respectively.

1        SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-  
2        tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate  
3        upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-  
4        tee, except that vouchers shall not be required—

5            (1) for the disbursement of salaries of employ-  
6        ees paid at an annual rate,

7            (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-  
8        vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and  
9        Doorkeeper, United States Senate,

10          (3) for the payment of stationery supplies pur-  
11        chased through the Keeper of the Stationery, United  
12        States Senate,

13          (4) for payments to the Postmaster, United  
14        States Senate,

15          (5) for the payment of metered charges on  
16        copying equipment provided by the Office of the Ser-  
17        geant at Arms and Doorkeeper, United States Sen-  
18        ate, or

19          (6) for the payment of Senate Recording and  
20        Photographic Services.

21        SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be  
22        necessary for agency contributions related to the com-  
23        pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,  
24        1997, through February 28, 1998, and March 1, 1998,

1 through February 28, 1999, to be paid from the Appro-  
2 priations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-  
3 tigations.”.
