Whereas the Senate has learned with profound sorrow and deep regret of the passing of our colleague, the Honorable Frank Tejada;

Whereas Representative Tejada has spent 4 years in the House of Representatives;

Whereas Representative Tejada served his country honorably in the United States Marine Corps from 1963 to 1967; and

Whereas Representative Tejada was awarded the Purple Heart, the Silver Star, the Commandant's Trophy, the Marine Corps Association Award, and the Colonel Phil

Yeckel Award for “the best combined record in leadership, academics, and physical fitness”: Now, therefore, be it

2 (1) when the Senate adjourns today, it adjourn
3 as a further mark of admiration and respect to the
4 memory of our departed friend and colleague, who
5 left his mark on Texas and our Nation; and

6 (2) the Senate extends to his family our
