RESOLUTION

To ensure that the Senate is in compliance with the Congressional Accountability Act with respect to permitting a disabled individual access to the Senate floor when that access is required to allow the disabled individual to discharge his or her official duties.

1 *Resolved*, That (a) an individual with a disability (as
2 defined in section 3 of the Americans with Disabilities Act
3 of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12102)) who has or is granted the
4 privilege of the Senate floor may bring those supporting
5 services (including service dogs, wheelchairs, and inter-
6 preters) on the Senate floor the employing or supervising
7 office determines are necessary to assist the disabled indi-

1 vidual in discharging the official duties of his or her posi-
2 tion.

3 (b) The employing or supervising office of a disabled
4 individual shall administer the provisions of this resolu-
5 tion.
