RESOLUTION

Whereas the American Medical Association is dedicated to maintaining the sanctity of the patient-physician relation-

ship and upholding ethical standards within the medical profession to lead to a better, stronger house of medicine;

Whereas the American Medical Association promotes its principles through medical school accreditation programs designed to elevate the standard of medical education in the United States through outreach, training seminars, and curriculum development in order to instill core ethical values and beliefs in the physicians of the future; and

Whereas the future of the American Medical Association relies not only on its past accomplishments, but on the physicians who will journey together for another 150 years and beyond of caring for the United States: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the Senate that—

2 (1) the American Medical Association is com-
3 mended for its advancement of high ethical stand-
4 ards among physicians in the United States and set-
5 ting the standards for physicians throughout the
6 world;

7 (2) all physicians and Americans are encour-
8 aged to join in the celebration of the 150th birthday
9 of the American Medical Association and rejoice in
10 150 years of caring for the United States; and

11 (3) the American Medical Association is encour-
12 aged to continue into the next millennium to rep-
13 resent and promote the goals of the organization in
14 the physician community, and to continue organizing
