CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress in support of the development and use of firearms personalization technology.

1	Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
2	concurring), That it is the sense of the Congress that—
3	(1) all firearms purchased by the Federal Gov-
4	ernment should include firearms personalization
5	technology as soon as such technology is readily
6	available;
7	(2) research and development to further im-
8	prove and perfect firearms personalization tech-

- 1 nology should be encouraged through greater Fed-
- eral funding; and
- 3 (3) within 5 years, all firearms purchases
- 4 should include firearms personalization technology.
- 5 For purposes of this resolution, the term "firearms per-
- 6 sonalization technology" means technology that prevents
- 7 anyone other than an authorized user of a firearm from
- 8 firing the firearm.
