Mr. Hastings of Florida submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- Expressing congratulations and thanks to United States and NATO troops for successfully bringing peace to Kosovo and halting the brutal ethnic cleansing of Kosovar Albanians.
- Whereas the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) air strikes on Kosovo have successfully halted the brutal ethnic cleansing of Kosovar Albanians in only eleven weeks;
- Whereas on June 10, 1999, Yugoslav President Slobodan Milosevic agreed to comply with international demands and has begun to withdraw Yugoslav troops from Kosovo;
- Whereas on June 10, 1999, NATO suspended air strikes on Yugoslavia and announced a withdrawal of combat troops from Kosovo and the entry of peacekeeping forces;

Whereas NATO troops were successful in bringing peace to Kosovo with an air campaign and did not require the mobilization of ground troops;

Whereas NATO suffered only 2 noncombat casualties; and

- Whereas NATO, President Clinton, Vice President Gore, and Secretary of State Madeleine Albright, successfully reached a peace agreement with Yugoslavia that ends all Yugoslav military action over Kosovo and the brutal ethnic cleansing of Kosovar Albanians: Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
 - 2 concurring), That the Congress expresses congratulations
 - 3 and thanks to United States and North Atlantic Treaty
 - 4 Organization (NATO) troops for swiftly and successfully
 - 5 bringing peace to Kosovo and ensuring the safety of
 - 6 Kosovar Albanians.
