Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
concurring), That it is the sense of the Congress that sanc tions should be imposed under section 821 or 824 of the
Nuclear Proliferation Prevention Act of 1994 only on
those persons who make direct and material contributions
to the use, development, production, stockpile, or other ac-

quisition of a nuclear explosive device or of missiles for
delivering a nuclear explosive device, by exporting or fi nancing the acquisition of items that can make such con tributions.
