## **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

Commending the decision to grant women in Kuwait the right to vote and run for elected office.

- Whereas His Royal Highness Emir Jabir al-Ahmad al-Jabir al-Sabah and the Kuwaiti Cabinet have recognized the right of Kuwaiti women citizens to participate in their country's electoral politics beginning in 2003;
- Whereas on May 16, 1999, the Emir decreed with the Cabinet's blessing that women should be given the right to vote and run for the elected national assembly; and
- Whereas many men and women in Kuwait have been advocating for human and political rights and full participation of all citizens in the political process: Now, therefore, be it
