Expressing the sense of Congress regarding the United Nations and global taxation.

3	(3) This is not the first time that proposals for
4	global taxation have come from the United Nations.
5	In 1996, former Secretary-General Boutros Boutros-
6	Ghali suggested a global tax, saying that it would
7	give the United Nations some financial independence
8	so that it was not "under the daily financial will of
9	the Member States".
