Mr. Weygand submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Supporting the results of the East Timor plebiscite held on August 30, 1999, and calling for an end to the violence in East Timor.

- Whereas in March 1999 Indonesia and Portugal reached an agreement to allow the people of East Timor a "direct vote" on independence;
- Whereas the vote, originally scheduled for August 8, 1999, took place August 30, 1999, and resulted in 78 percent of the voting East Timorese choosing independence;
- Whereas since the election there has been an escalation of violence perpetrated by the anti-independence paramilitary forces, reported to be assisted by the Indonesian military and police; and

- 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate2 concurring), That the Congress—
- 3 (1) supports the results of the East Timor pleb-4 iscite held on August 30, 1999;
- 5 (2) strongly urges the Government of Indonesia 6 to end the military and police involvement with the 7 anti-independence militia;
 - (3) strongly urges the Government of Indonesia to end the violence in East Timor immediately and begin taking steps to honor the election results;
 - (4) urges the President to provide the United Nations whatever assistance is needed to help secure the peace and independence of the East Timorese; and
 - (5) urges the United Nations to take immediate action, including the deployment of peacekeeping forces, to end the outbreak of violence in East Timor.
