## **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

To designate a flagpole upon which the flag of the United States is to be set at half-staff whenever a law enforcement officer is slain in the line of duty.

- 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate

- 3 SECTION 1. INSTRUCTION.
- 4 (a) Slain Law Enforcement Officers.—The
- 5 Capitol Police Board shall designate or establish a flagpole
- 6 upon which the flag of the United States shall be flown
- 7 at half-staff for one day whenever a Federal, State, local,

- 1 or territorial law enforcement officer is slain in the line2 of duty.
- 3 (b) Establishment of Procedures.—The Capitol
- 4 Police Board shall establish efficient and effective proce-
- 5 dures to execute subsection (a), and to—
- (1) ensure that the official responsible for setting the flag of the United States is informed or learns promptly of the slaying of any law enforcement officer;
  - (2) post public notice in close proximity to the flag being flown at half-staff of the name, tenure of service, and jurisdiction of a slain law enforcement officer being honored; and
    - (3) present the flag of the United States which is flown at half-staff in honor of a slain law enforcement officer to the family of the slain law enforcement officer.
