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## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the opening  
ceremonies of Sunrayce 99.

1       *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2   *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR OPENING**  
2 **CEREMONIES OF SUNRAYCE 99.**

3 The organizers of Sunrayce 99 (in this resolution re-  
4 ferred to as the “sponsor”) shall be permitted to sponsor  
5 a public event, with solar-powered cars, on the Capitol  
6 Grounds on June 20, 1999, or on such other dates as the  
7 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Com-  
8 mittee on Rules and Administration of the Senate may  
9 jointly designate, to conduct opening ceremonies for  
10 Sunrayce 99.

11 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized by section  
13 1 shall be free of admission charge to the public and ar-  
14 ranged not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under  
15 conditions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol  
16 and the Capitol Police Board.

17 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall  
18 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities  
19 incident to all activities associated with the event.

20 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

21 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the  
22 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the sponsor may  
23 erect upon the Capitol Grounds such stage, sound amplifi-  
24 cation devices, and other related structures and equipment  
25 as may be required for the event authorized by section  
26 1.

1 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of  
2 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized  
3 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re-  
4 quired to carry out the event, including arrangements to  
5 limit access to First Street between Independence Avenue  
6 Southwest and Constitution Avenue Northwest.

7 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

8 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-  
9 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act  
10 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-  
11 cerning sales, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol  
12 Grounds, as well as other restrictions applicable to the  
13 Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event authorized by  
14 section 1.

15 **SEC. 5. LIMITATION ON REPRESENTATIONS.**

16 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized by section  
17 1 may be conducted only after the Architect of the Capitol  
18 and the Capitol Police Board enter into an agreement with  
19 the sponsor that prohibits the sponsor—

20 (1) from representing, either directly or indi-  
21 rectly, that this resolution or any activity carried out  
22 under this resolution in any way constitutes approval  
23 or endorsement by the Federal Government of any  
24 product or service offered by the sponsor; and

1           (2) from using any photograph taken at the  
2           event for a commercial purpose.

(b) **PENALTIES.**—The agreement shall provide for financial penalties to be imposed if any photograph is used in violation of this section.
