CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- Whereas on April 20, 1999, two armed gunmen opened fire at Columbine High School in Littleton, Colorado, killing 12 students and 1 teacher and wounding more than 20 others; and
- Whereas local, State, and Federal law enforcement personnel performed their duties admirably and risked their lives

for the safety of the students, faculty, and staff at Columbine High School: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
 concurring), That Congress—

3 (1) condemns, in the strongest possible terms,
4 the heinous atrocities which occurred at Columbine
5 High School in Littleton, Colorado;

6 (2) offers its condolences to the families, 7 friends, and loved ones of those who were killed at 8 Columbine High School and expresses its hope for 9 the rapid and complete recovery of those wounded in 10 the shooting;

(3) applauds the hard work and dedication exhibited by the hundreds of local, State, and Federal
law enforcement officials and the others who offered
their support and assistance; and

(4) encourages the American people to engage
in a national dialogue on preventing school violence.
