JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to provide that Federal judges be reconfirmed by the Senate every 10 years.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

1	"ARTICLE —
2	"Notwithstanding section 1 of article III of this Con-
3	stitution, a judge of an inferior court created under that
4	article may not, except with the consent of the Senate,
5	hold office for more than 10 years after—
6	"(1) the judge took office,
7	"(2) the Senate last consented to the continu-
8	ance in office of the judge, or
9	"(3) the ratification of this article,
10	whichever last occurs.".
