## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relative to contributions and expenditures intended to affect elections for Federal and State office.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

1	"ARTICLE —
2	"Section 1. Congress shall have power to set reason-
3	able limits on expenditures made in support of or in oppo-
4	sition to the nomination or election of any person to Fed-
5	eral office.
6	"Section 2. Each State shall have power to set rea-
7	sonable limits on expenditures made in support of or in
8	opposition to the nomination or election of any person to
9	State office.
10	"Section 3. Congress shall have power to enforce
