## JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to allow the States to limit the period of time United States Senators and Representatives may serve.

1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives

2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the

4 following article is proposed as an amendment to the Con5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
9 for ratification:

## ARTICLE —

2 SECTION 1. Each State or the people thereof may 3 prescribe the maximum number of terms to which a per-4 son may be elected or appointed to the Senate of the 5 United States.

6 SECTION 2. Each State or the people thereof may
7 prescribe the maximum number of terms to which a per8 son may be elected to the House of Representatives of the
9 United States.

10 SECTION 3. This article shall become inoperative un-11 less it shall have been ratified by the legislatures of three-12 fourths of the several States within seven years from the 13 date of its submission to the States by the Congress.
